BULLYING, HARASSMENT, OR INTIMIDATION REPORTING FORM

DIRECTIONS: Complete this form if you are a student victim, the parent/guardian of a student victim, a close adult relative of a student victim, bystander, or a school staff member and wish to report an incident of alleged bullying, harassment or intimidation. Return the completed form to the Principal at the alleged student victim's school. Contact the school for additional information or assistance at any time. Bullying, harassment, or intimidation are serious and will not be tolerated.

This form is to be confidentially maintained in accordance with the Safe Schools Reporting Act of 2005, Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1232g. For more information, please see Board Policy numbers: 5517.01, 1662, 3362, 4362, and 5517.

DEFINITIONS:

Bullying – Unwanted, demeaning behavior among individuals that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. The behavior is repeated, or is highly likely to be repeated, over time. To be considered *bullying*, the behavior must be intentional and include: (1) an imbalance of power (students who bully use their physical, emotional, social, or academic power to control, exclude, or harm others), and (2) repetition (bullying behaviors happen more than once or are highly likely to be repeated based on evidence gathered).

Example Harassment Behaviors

Verbal Aggression - name calling, mocking, teasing, intimidating phone calls, spreading rumors, threats, etc.

Intimidation - getting in someone's face, taking things, demanding money, items, or harmful/negative behavior, extortion, hazing, etc.

Emotional - excluding, tormenting, threatening gestures, condescension, ridicule, staring, etc.

Physical Aggression - pushing, kicking, punching, slapping, tripping, pinching, spitting, etc.

Sexual—touching, dirty jokes, flirting, asking out on dates after being told no, etc.

Racial - comments or nicknames based upon physical, behavioral or cultural differences.

Written - threatening or inappropriate notes or drawings.

Electronic - threatening/intimidating Facebook comments, messages, wall posts, images, text messages, emails, etc.

Bullying, Harassment, or Intimidation Four-Part Test: For the purposes of (Board Policy 5517.01) and in accordance with Ohio law, bullying, harassment, or intimidation is intentional conduct, including verbal, physical, or written conduct, or an intentional electronic communication, that creates a hostile environment by substantially interfering with a student's educational benefits, opportunities, or performance, or with a student's physical or psychological well-being and is either:

- i. Motivated by a student's actual or a perceived personal characteristic(s) or ability(s); or
- ii. Sexual in nature, including descriptions or depictions of a student their intimate parts exposed or engaged in an act of sexual contact; or
- iii. Threatening or seriously intimidating; and occurs on school property, at a school-sponsored activity or event, or school bus; or substantially disrupts the orderly operation of a school.

Notice of Nondiscrimination

The Board will provide persons who have experienced Sexual Harassment ongoing remedies as reasonably necessary to restore or preserve access to the District's education programs and activities.
This policy applies to Sexual Harassment that occurs within the District's education programs and activities and that is committed by a member of the School District community or a Third Party.
This policy does not apply to Sexual Harassment that occurs off school grounds, in a private setting, and outside the scope of the District's education programs and activities; such Sexual Misconduct/Sexual Activity may be prohibited by the Student Code of Conduct if committed by a student, or by Board policies and administrative guidelines, applicable State and/or Federal laws if committed by a Board employee.
Consistent with the U.S. Department of Education's implementing regulations for Title IX, this policy does not apply to Sexual Harassment that occurs outside the geographic boundaries of the United States, even if the Sexual Harassment occurs in the District's education programs or activities. Sexual Harassment that occurs outside the geographic boundaries of the United States is governed by the Student Code of Conduct if committed by a student, or by Board policies and administrative guidelines, applicable State and/or Federal laws if committed by a Board employee.
